
Graduate Exit Census Survey (GECS) Undergraduate Class of May 2017

The University of Michigan is committed to providing opportunities for all students to participate in highimpact engaged learning experiences. These experiences develop students' capabilities along many dimensions, including their creativity, intercultural engagement, understanding of civic responsibility and ethical reasoning, collaboration and communication skills, and self-agency and ability to manage risk and effect change (see <u>http://engaged.umich.edu/engaged-learning/goals-practices/</u>).

This first-ever report provides a comprehensive snapshot of the level of our students' self-reported participation in a set of high-impact and action-oriented engaged learning practices. When applying for graduation, undergraduates now complete a required questionnaire (GECS) about their participation in these experiences while at U-M (see page 4 for survey questionnaire).

This report provides GECS results for students who received a Bachelor's degree in May 2017. GECS went live on October 12, 2016; it does not reflect the entire May 2017 graduating cohort. The response rate for May 2017 graduates was 78% (**n=4,299**), because the survey launched after students began applying to graduate. The response rate will be closer to 100% in subsequent years.

Students are counted once in the U-M overall report and individually in the school/college reports.

96% of graduating seniors report participating in at least one type of engaged learning experience during their time at U-M.








University-Wide by Sex


Overall, female students report equal or higher participation than male students in all types of engaged learning experiences, except for entrepreneurship.

University-Wide by Citizenship Status

When compared to domestic students, international students report comparable or higher levels of participation across the experience types, except for civic engagement.




*Domestic includes U.S. Citizens & Permanent Residents. Figures based on responses from 3,923 domestic students and 376 international students.

Underrepresented minority (URM) students report comparable or higher levels of participation than non-URM students across the experience types.




International experience

Entrepreneurship



University-wide by Pell Grant Status

Pell recipients report equal or higher participation than non-Pell recipient students in civic engagement, research, and creative work experiences.



*Pell grant status is gathered from U-M records. Figures based on responses from 734 Pell recipients and 3,565 non-recipients. International students are not eligible for federal financial aid and are included in non-recipients.
